Mark 15:16-39

Discussion Questions

Opener: How would you explain the death of Jesus to an unbelieving friend?

Read Mark 15:33-39

- 1. The darkness (v. 33) points to God's wrath and judgment (cf Joel 2:1-2). Why do you think the idea that God is angry with sin is so unpopular today?
- 2. "If God is loving, surely he must to be angry with the way we treat one another." Do you agree? Why?
- 3. Jesus' cry (v. 34) suggests God's wrath is directed toward Him rather than the people crucifying Him. Jesus was sinless, so why is God punishing him? (cf. Mark 10:45, 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. What does the tearing of the temple curtain (v. 38) show us about what Jesus' death accomplished?
 - a. Why do we tend to take our access to God for granted?
 - b. How does this passage help motivate us to appreciate it more fully?
- 5. Why is the Roman centurion's declaration in verse 39 surprising?
 - a. What does it show us about the power of the cross? (cf. Colossians 1:21-22; Ephesians 2:13)
 - b. How does this give us hope as we pray for our friends and neighbors to come to know Jesus?

Read Mark 15:6-39

- 6. List out the various different responses we see to Jesus and his crucifixion.
- 7. How do we encounter similar responses to today?

Prayer Ideas:

- Pray for friends, neighbors, family members or work colleagues who don't yet understand the cross and what it means for them.
 - Give thanks that God has put them in your life.
 - o Pray that God will help you demonstrate Christ's love to them in word and deed.
 - o Ask God to open their eyes, just as he did with the centurion (v.39).
