

For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. I give Egypt as your ransom, Cush and Seba in exchange for you. I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you. I will say to the north, Give up, and to the south, Do not withhold: bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the end of the earth, everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

communal confession

adapted from the Valley of Vision, Book of Puritan Prayers, - "Man a Nothing"

O Lord, I am a shell full of dust, yet animated and made anew by an unseen power of grace. I am deeply convinced of the evil and misery of my sinful state, of my vanity and self-possession - even as I am the sufficiency of Christ. This is my conflict. When you would guide me, I seek to control myself. When you would be sovereign, I seek to rule. When you would take care of me, I seek my own sufficiency. When my forgiven-and-righteous identity should be found in you, I define myself in the eyes of others. When I should study, love, honor and trust you, I give such attention to myself, others and the world. Forgive me through Jesus. Convince me that I cannot be my own God.
