Discussion Questions

Read Jonah 2

The glorious experience of saving grace (1-6)

- 1. In what sense is Jonah undeserving and helpless when God rescues him? (
- 2. Read Ephesians 2:1-10. In what sense are we undeserving and helpless when God rescued us?
 - a. How might knowing this impact the way we relate to:
 - i. God
 - ii. Other people
- 3. In what *positive* ways does Jonah respond to God's rescue? (hint: think about what 2:2-9 is and look at 3:1-3)
 - a. How should we respond to the fact that God has rescued us?

The glaring ignorance of saving grace (7-10)

- 4. One author called Jonah 2, "the prayer that made the fish vomit". Do you think he was being too harsh on Jonah? Why or why not?
- 5. What evidence is there that Jonah didn't undeserving and helpless he was apart from God's grace?
- 6. In the sermon, three pieces of evidence were listed:
 - His failure to confess his sin
 - His focus on himself (7)
 - His feeling that he is superior (8-9)
 - a. Where do you witness these in our own lives?
 - b. What can we do to cultivate a deeper appreciation of God's grace toward us?
 - c. In what practical ways can we express an appreciation of God's grace (hint: think about the *opposite* of these three things!)

Prayer Ideas:

- Pray God that he has saved us even 'when we were dead in our trespasses and sins'.
- Pray that God will help us understand just how undeserving and helpless we are apart from Jesus.
- Pray that understanding God's grace will lead us to worship and give us a deeper zeal to service others.
